Discussing symbols of peace, how to make peace in our classroom and how to give yourself inner peace.

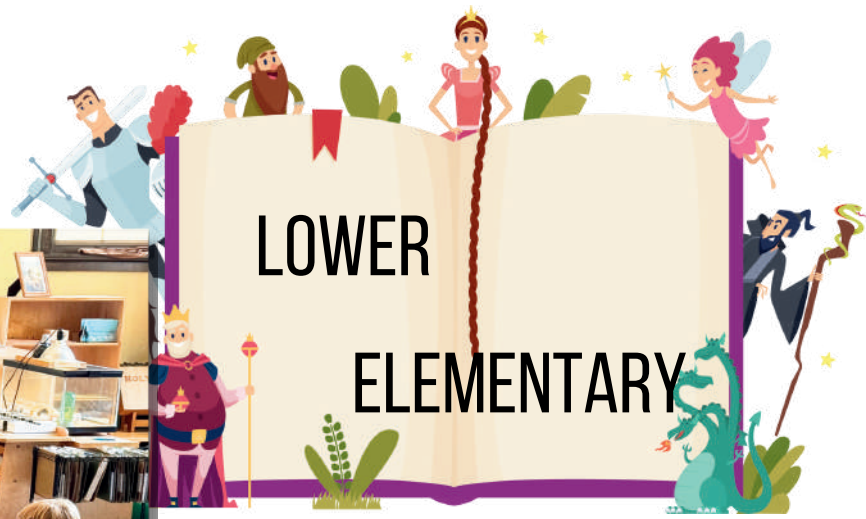
Practicing:

How to work independently and in a group





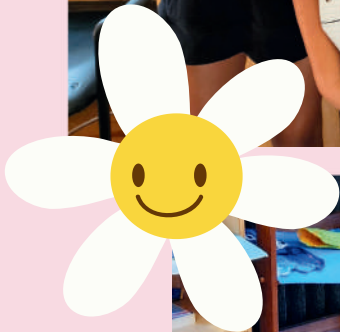
